In 1934, the great poet T.S. Eliot wrote the play, *The Rock*. It was performed as a pageant to raise funds for building of new churches throughout London. If you remember your history, it was a time of great upheaval. Eliot had the temerity to speak up and speak out against fascism and communism. While it looked as though the Church was dying and becoming an afterthought, Eliot wrote about humanity's relationship to God. He understood the battles that every generation fights to hold onto faith or risk losing it altogether.

The entire text of *The Rock* covers twenty-pages. I encourage you to take the time to read over those words as they are not just beautiful, especially in their context, but they speak to our times. You may find the entire text here: www.arak29.am/PDF_PPT/6-Literature/Eliot/Chtherock_eng.htm.

In the opening stanza, T.S. Eliot writes:

The Eagle soars in the summit of Heaven,
The Hunter with his dogs pursues his circuit.
O perpetual revolution of configured stars,
O perpetual recurrence of determined seasons,
O world of spring and autumn, birth and dying!
The endless cycle of idea and action,
Endless invention, endless experiment,
Brings knowledge of motion, but not of stillness;
Knowledge of speech, but not of silence;
Knowledge of words, and ignorance of the Word.
All our knowledge brings us nearer to our ignorance,
All our ignorance brings us nearer to death,
But nearness to death no nearer to GOD.
Where is the Life we have lost in living?
Where is the wisdom we have lost in knowledge?
Where is the knowledge we have lost in information?
The cycles of Heaven in twenty centuries
Bring us farther from GOD and nearer to the Dust.

Here, Eliot acknowledges that so much of what the world pursues is ultimately worthless. From a worldly perspective, we may be pursuing and creating much, but that which we gain is ultimately meaningless. Ultimately, we may know more words, but not the Word. What we gain

only proves our ignorance and adds nothing to our lives. Instead of gain, we are at a great loss. We move farther from God and lose our lives.

That's why I cling to the great motto of the Reformation: *Semper Reformanda*—always reforming! The phrase stood for “the Church reformed, always reforming” and was to remind each generation to discover, hold onto, and pass along the great doctrines of the faith. Each generation of believers hold the opportunity to keep the faith pure and holy or let it slip out of their hands. Whatever a generation of believers receives from the previous ones, it has within its grasp to restore the faith in its lifetime and to provide a better foundation for the generation to come.

In *The Rock*, Eliot knew that the Church could slip away in his generation, but he had faith in the opportunities that were right before him and all the faithful of his day as well. Whatever challenges confronted them, Eliot believed that faith could overcome. He also knew the cost. Reforming the Church is persistent work and tiring as believers must fight the currents of the world. There are many in the Church in every generation who would rather drift with fleshly desire than to be sanctified and to stand with God. It's easier to give into the world than to mortify the flesh and to allow the Holy Spirit to guide you into deeper faith and greater works [**Romans 8:13**].



In the close of *The Rock*, Eliot acknowledges the challenges alongside the ultimate reward for the faithful:

In our rhythm of earthly life we tire of light. We are glad when the day ends, when the play ends; and ecstasy is too much pain. We are children quickly tired: children who are up in the night and fall asleep as the rocket is fired; and the day is long for work or play. We tire of distraction or concentration, we sleep and are glad to sleep, Controlled by the rhythm of blood and the day and the night and the seasons. And we must extinguish the candle, put out the light and relight it; Forever must quench, forever relight the flame. Therefore we thank Thee for our little light, that is dappled with shadow. We thank Thee who hast moved us to building, to finding, to forming at the ends of our fingers and beams of our eyes. And when we have built an altar to the Invisible Light, we may set thereon the little lights for which our bodily vision is made. And we thank Thee that darkness reminds us of light. O Light Invisible, we give Thee thanks for Thy great glory!

Each year, I ask you to go on a journey with me to read through the Bible this year. In this newsletter, you will find a reading plan. Utilize it, or find a plan that better suits you. But please, dear friend, take that journey through the Word. Along with Eliot, we know what it means to tire in our labors for the right and the good. We desire rest and sleep when we should stand awake (see **Matthew 24:36-25:13**).

I hope that you rekindle a light in 2022 for the LORD. I pray that light causes you to rebuild the Church and begin to do so by (re)committing to building up the fellowship here at St. John's. In the beginning of 2022, our sermons will center on spiritual gifts. God, by His grace, has given each believer spiritual gifts to strengthen the local church and to help us share our faith with others, which strengthens the Church.

The big C Church refers to the body of Christ alive and active throughout the world and through the generations.

The little c church refers to a local gathering. As we discover our spiritual gifts and employ them, we build an altar to the Invisible Light as Eliot put it. Upon that altar, we set our little lights. Together, those lights combine to bring glory to God and to advance His work in the world.

I hope and pray that 2022 is a year in which the light of Christ is rekindled in His people here, and we shine brightly with heavenly light as St. John's Evangelical Church embarks upon a season of renewal and revitalization. I am encouraged to pastor here amongst. I look forwarding to helping you steward your spiritual gifts as God's church thrives. Like T.S. Eliot, I understand the threats to our survival and growth. Also like Eliot, I have faith in people who are committed to God above all else. Such faith is greater than any faith. After all the fascists and the communists that threatened the Church in the 20th century rose and fell just as those who stand against the Church today will fall away.

In 2022, stand with the LORD. He will never fail you. His Truth will give you life and help you thrive until you meet Him face to face.

What we're Teaching this month...

Wednesday Kids- will be beginning a 5week series from the New Testament about Jesus' early life & ministry. Museums have the unique ability to transform learning! Instead of merely reading words on a page, we can experience them through all of our senses! A Day at the Museum is a series all about helping kids interact with the stories of Jesus and connecting them to God. Jesus' life and early ministry helps all of us experience (see, hear . . . even taste!) and follow God in new, tangible, and real ways.

Sunday Youth- will be beginning Biblical journal prompts. Journal writing is great for triggering teenagers' imaginations, getting them to look at the world in a new and precious ways. But like most writing, it has to be fun or they simply won't do it. In these prompts teens will be asked to put themselves in a Bible characters' shoes. Others ask them to think of their own lives in new and interesting ways. Each one will encourage Christian growth, though sometimes such is subtle. The ultimate design in each prompt is to keep interest. Along with each prompt, there is one Bible lookup. Sometimes the lookup is a Bible story, and sometimes just a Scripture that either closely or very loosely relates to the assignment. Again, the lookups are meant to inspire but not to give the prompts as "assignment" feeling.

New year, new resolutions, new beginnings, has anything really changed? Let's look back to our Congregational meetings in January of the early 1880s. Our recent declines in membership have now brought us back to these 1880s' membership levels (below 150 active members). From our Council Minutes:

"Kenton, OH, 1 Jan 1881

The yearly meeting of the congregation took place today on 1 Jan 1881 after the Sunday service was finished.

After Mr. Pastor Sickel opened the meeting, the secretary presented the financial report. First the one from 1879, since he was unable to do so last year due to sickness, and then the one for 1880. Both reports were accepted and recognized as correct. From the financial report of 1880, a deficit for the church servant of \$10 was revealed. This was, because there were multiple Sundays with funerals, on which the money collection did not happen, and the church servant is entitled to \$1.00 per funeral. Because of this, it was decided, that for every funeral sermon, Sundays like during the week, one dollar shall be paid into the municipal fund.

The secretary reported then about the paying of the debt:

Of the last signatures and old monthly subscriptions this was the income 1 Jan: \$701.25.

Money in municipal fund on 1 June: \$127.11

Sum: \$828.36

Amount of bills paid: \$700.61

Left over: \$127.73

Still to pay 1. Bills: \$1234.36

2. for the organ: \$100.00

Sum: \$1334.36

Still to come: \$304.00

Left over to pay when everything has come in: \$1030.36

The report was accepted, and the treasurer was instructed to use incoming money immediately to pay off bills.

In the following election Wilhelm Ochs and Konrad Koch were reelected and instead of Mr. Adam Kress, Mr. Johannes Alt Senior was elected. All of them for 2 years.

The meeting was adjourned.

Kenton, OH 1 Jan 1882

The usual yearly meeting of the congregation of the St. Johannes church was moved until next Sunday.

Sunday, 7 Jan 1882

After the church service, the election of the 1 Jan 1882 was carried out, to elect new church officials. Theodor Schindewolf, Elder Georg Blum and Chairman Adam Gerlach, whose time of service was ending, were reelected for 2 years. The financial report of the congregation was also read and accepted.

Attested Wilhelm Ochs – Secretary

Kenton, OH 1 Jan 1883

The prior announced meeting of the congregation was opened with a prayer by Mr. Pastor Betz.

1. The protocol of 1 Jan 1882 was read and accepted.

2. A proposal was made and accepted unanimously by the congregation, that every quarter, there shall be a meeting of the congregation. Those shall take place on 1 Jan, the first Sunday in April, first Sunday in July and the first Sunday in Oct.

3. The financial report of 1882 was read and accepted.

4. The election took place. Since the time of service for 3 members of the council had come to an end, 3 new officials would be elected in their stead. 6 candidates were up for election: 1. Konrad Koehler, 2. Phillip Daniel, 3. Nicolaus Lotz, 4. Nicolaus Glock, 5. Georg Resch, 6. Ulrich Blum.

The result was the following:

Konrad Koehler received 18 votes, Phillip Daniel 9 votes, Nicolaus Lotz 13 votes, Nicolaus Glock 7 votes, Georg Resch 11 votes and Ulrich Blum 2 votes.

This means Konrad Koehler was elected with 18 votes, Nicolaus Lotz was elected with 13 votes and Georg Resch was elected with 11 votes.

Nicolaus Lotz expressed the wish to be excused due to sickness. Nicolaus Lotz was excused by the congregation and Phillip Daniel was elected in his stead with 9 votes. The new officials were elected for 2 years. Since there was not further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Attested – Wilhelm Ochs, Secretary”

Keeping in mind that these years were just before St. John's period of exponential growth, what do you notice most about these minutes from about 140 years ago?

From my perspective:

Nothing of significance was brought before the Congregation. The “big news” was that the Pastor had not been paid for Sundays when there was a funeral.

The fact that “business as usual” and the boring repetition of the process is on full display.

Have our Congregational meetings become similar to these? Have we become lethargic?

This year ask yourself if you are fully committed to our Church? What can we as individuals do to revive the will to move forward for Christ & Church? Attend the Annual Meeting and let your voice be heard.

Book-at-a-Time Bible Reading Plan

The book-at-a-time Bible reading plan provides two readings for each day. these readings will take you through the entire Bible in one year.

To prevent the frustration of falling behind and to provide some reflection time, each month consists of only 25 readings. You'll have several days each month to meditate more deeply on something that was significant to you in the past week, to catch up on missed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.

The first reading alternates between Old and New Testament books, giving you three or four chapters a day. The Gospels are spread throughout the year.

The second reading takes you through a chapter or so of the wisdom literature and Isaiah. Combined, on missed readings, or to revisit favorite passages.
