

Scripture Readings (ESV):

Luke 19:1-10:

¹ He entered Jericho and was passing through. ² And behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector and was rich. ³ And he was seeking to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was small in stature. ⁴ So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see Him, for He was about to pass that way. ⁵ And when Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." ⁶ So he hurried and came down and received Him joyfully. ⁷ And when they saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." ⁸ And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor. And if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." ⁹ And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

Revelation 3:14-22:

¹⁴ "And to the angel of the church in Laodicea write: 'The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of God's creation. ¹⁵ "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! ¹⁶ So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth. ¹⁷ For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing, not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. ¹⁸I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see. 19 Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent. ²⁰ Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with Me. 21 The one who conquers, I will grant him to sit with Me on My throne, as I also conquered and sat down with My Father on His throne. ²² He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

Sermon: Trading Rags for Riches

1.	How does Zacchaeus repent in response to Christ's saving grace
	(Luke 19:8)? How does the world see repentance in you? What
	acts have you done in response to the saving grace of Christ that
	brings salvation and saves the lost (Luke 19:9-10)?

2. How would you describe your faith according to Christ's scale: hot, cold, or warm (Revelation 3:15-16)? Why? Do you rely on your ability or Christ's gifts to live out your faith (Revelation 3:17)? How?

3. How do you invite Christ into your life and dine with Him (Revelation 3:20)? Being in the presence of Jesus radically changes a believer as it did with Zacchaeus. How do you act differently because of the presence of Jesus in your life? How do others see that change lived out?

4. At the end of this study, what have you ears heard that was said by the Spirit to the churches (**Revelation 3:22**)? What will you apply to yourself, St. John's, and to those around you? How will you live out your life of faith in response to this?
