

As we enter the season of Lent, I often dwell on the phrase that I have repeated numerous times as I have imparted an ashen cross to the forehead of a fellow believer, "You are dust, and to dust you shall return..." Those words have taken on an added weight this year after having received a diagnosis that cancer has literally taken me by the throat. My days of returning to the dust may be closer than I dreamt. Still, when imparting the ashes, we do not end with returning to the dust. Rather, we emphasize, "...but the steadfast love of the Lord endures forever" (see 136th Psalm).

In Lent, we are called to what is traditionally referred to as a penitent time. It is a time to be sorrowful for our sin. While we may have been born with original sin, we have continued legacy by continuing to sin—sometimes

with joy and pride! Lent calls us to recall the consequences of our sin. Lent reminds us that if we had been alone in the garden, we too would have succumbed to temptation and bitten the forbidden fruit. Lent calls us to understand our sin more deeply and weep over it.

Until we plumb the depths of our sin, we will never understand our need for a great savior. And that is who and what Jesus Christ is to us. As the book of **Hebrews** begins, it reminds us that God gave us His only begotten Son to confront our sin and to free us from the bonds of death. He, the Creator of the world, has come to be its Redeemer. Jesus comes as a great High Priest and as the perfect sacrifice (**Hebrews 7-10**). He came as one who is able "to sympathize with our weaknesses" and " who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin" (**Hebrews 4:15**).



He is one of us and yet so very different from us. He comes to very clearly show us the way. The author of **Hebrews** (who is never identified) expertly ties the Old Testament to the New Testament. In the Old Testament, we see the shadows of what was to come namely Christ and His salvation. Through Him we are freed from sin and death.

In chapter **11**, the author of Hebrews gives to us what has been referred to as the Hall of Fame of Faith. There, starting with Abel and going through the prophets, he shows how people lived, suffered and died without knowing the fulfillment of the Old Testament. As chapter **11** gives way to chapter **12**, we read, "Therefore, since we are

surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our



faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (**Hebrews 12:1-2**).

Like the believers in olden times, Jesus too died. For Him, it came with the shame of the Cross and the weight of our sins upon

His shoulders. The book of **Hebrews** lays out who Christ is to close with two chapters (**12-13**), which serves to exhort and encourage believers to endure difficult times and to suffer for the

greater good. Sometimes, God calls us to difficult times to discipline us and to sanctify us for continued service (**Hebrews 12:7-11**). Sometimes, as the previous chapter showed, we are called to offer our lives.

All of this was written that we should not fear whatever may come. As chapter **13** lays out, we need to respond with faith and compassion and generosity. In spite of adversity, we are to live out our faith in the community of the church. We are to follow our leaders with joy



(**Hebrews 13:17**). Faith in Christ means living sacrificially to the point of giving ones life for God.

Shortly after learning of my diagnosis, some people believed that my thoughts had taken a rather dark and morbid turn. I shared my conviction

that Job's words to his wife are equally true of me: "You speak as one of the foolish women would speak. Shall we receive good from God, and shall we not receive evil?' In all this Job did not sin with his lips" (**Job 2:10**).

My cancer is not the work of the Devil or some other nefarious source. Satan has no claim on me. I believe in the absolute sovereignty of God. Monotheism teaches me there is but One God. The Devil has no authority in my life as I have been bought by the blood of Christ. Whatever comes is due to the outworking of God's plan for my life. I will be healed if it is God's will. I will be called home to Glory when it is God's will. I live abiding in those promises.

Until those results are in, I will faithfully proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ from the pulpit and with my life. In Lent, I remember my sin, the sins of the world, and the consequences that have been wrought by those sins. I will also remember that the Father's love is greater than my sin, that Christ's sacrifice is sufficient for my salvation (and for everyone who calls upon His name), and that the Holy Spirit will guide us faithfully through the trials and tribulations of this life. In Lent, we look at the disease for which no human creates a vaccine, but for which there is a divine cure.

Having that cure does not deliver us from struggles or hardships. Having that cure does not guarantee us long life or prosperity. It does grant to us a fulfilled life and a good life. Having Christ, who is the Cure, gives us a way to live by faith. As the book of **Hebrews** teaches us: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (11:1).

Lent reminds us that we have too long lived for the things that we have seen. We have sought to possess worldly things and pleasures and squandered opportunities to cling to the unseen glory of the Kingdom of God. If we return in faith, we can find our way again in Christ. We can find satisfaction in the days we have, whatever their length. We find comfort in God, and the plan He has for our lives. May the benediction found in **Hebrews 13:20** -21 (see below) comfort our souls as the Holy Spirit works in us what is pleasing to the Father through Jesus Christ the Son. May our lives point to His Glory Alone. May that be our assertion this Lent whatever our circumstances.




Community Sonrise Service

Since our church has taken on new beauty and dignity all members and friends should find it impelling and compelling to say with the Psalmist of old" "Lord, I have loved the habitation of Thy house; and the place where Thine honor dwelleth. Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God hath shined. Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise; be thankful unto Him and bless His name. For the Lord is good: His mercy is everlasting; and His truth endureth to all generations. I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord. Pray for the peace of Jerusalem; they shall prosper that love Thee. Peace be within Thy wall and prosperity within Thy tabernacles. Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity: Sing unto the Lord with thanksgiving; sing praise upon the harp unto our God; who covereth the heaven with clouds, who prepareth rain for the earth, who maketh grass to grow upon the mountains. The Lord taketh pleasure in them that fear Him, in those that hope in His mercy. Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove Me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven; and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. He hath showed thee, O man, what is good. And what doth the Lord require of thee but do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with Thy God?. 
