

Scripture Readings (ESV):

Proverbs 10:8-14:

- ⁸The wise of heart will receive commandments, but a babbling fool will come to ruin.
- ⁹ Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but he who makes his ways crooked will be found out.
- ¹⁰ Whoever winks the eye causes trouble, and a babbling fool will come to ruin.
- ¹¹ The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence.
- ¹² Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all offenses.
- ¹³ On the lips of him who has understanding, wisdom is found, but a rod is for the back of him who lacks sense.
- ¹⁴ The wise lay up knowledge, but the mouth of a fool brings ruin near.

James 5:13-20:

- ¹³ Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise. ¹⁴ Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. ¹⁷ Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. ¹⁸ Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit.
- ¹⁹ My brothers, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and someone brings him back, ²⁰ let him know that whoever brings back a sinner from his wandering will save his soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.



Hello everyone!

I wanted to give a quick update on the latest progress with LifeWise Academy. We have a lot of exciting news.

The first is that we now have a LifeWise website! - <u>Lifewise.org/kentonoh</u>

On that page you can register your child for Lifewise, sign up to volunteer or donate. We are still adding to it but are thrilled to have the page up already. We also have a Facebook page-

The second item is that we have hired our first teacher, Melissa Weaver! We are looking for 3 more teachers. Currently, we have received inquiries from 7 interested people and are awaiting applications. Please pray for us as we seek to find these teachers.

The third item is that we have been notified that we definitely will be able to purchase a bus directly from LifeWise! We should receive it in late May or early June. This will help with cost and we know the bus will have been maintained.

We will be starting our capital fundraising campaign soon. Starting this week I will be traveling to churches to present LifeWise as well as explaining our needs for personnel and finances in establishing our first-year program.
