

Scripture Readings (ESV):

Esther 9:20-22:

²⁰ And Mordecai recorded these things and sent letters to all the Jews who were in all the provinces of King Ahasuerus, both near and far, ²¹ obliging them to keep the fourteenth day of the month Adar and also the fifteenth day of the same, year by year, ²² as the days on which the Jews got relief from their enemies, and as the month that had been turned for them from sorrow into gladness and from mourning into a holiday; that they should make them days of feasting and gladness, days for sending gifts of food to one another and gifts to the poor.

Luke 14:12-24:

¹² He said also to the man who had invited him, "When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. ¹³ But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, ¹⁴ and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

¹⁵ When one of those who reclined at table with Him heard these things, he said to Him, "Blessed is everyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!" ¹⁶ But He said to him, "A man once gave a great banquet and invited many. ¹⁷ And at the time for the banquet he sent his servant to say to those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.' ¹⁸ But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a field, and I must go out and see it. Please have me excused.' ¹⁹ And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them. Please have me excused.' ²⁰ And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' ²¹ So the servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house became angry and said to his servant, 'Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in the poor and crippled and blind and lame.' ²² And the servant said, 'Sir, what you commanded has been done, and still there is room.' ²³ And the master said to the servant, 'Go out to the highwavs and hedges and compel people to come in, that my house may be filled. ²⁴ For I tell you, none of those men who were invited shall taste my banquet.""

Sermon Notes 21 May 2023 Scripture: Esther 9:20-22; Luke 14:12-24 Sermon: Come to the Banquet

- How do you celebrate your deliverance and salvation? Do you celebrate as the Jews did at the institution of Purim in Esther's day? Do you include the poor in your celebrations (Esther 9:22)?
- 2. Do you heed Jesus' counsel and include the poor, crippled, blind and lame (**Luke 14:13**) when you host a celebration or do you invite your 'inner circle,' those who can repay you with an invitation to their next celebration?

3. When you hear Christ's invitation, do you respond wholeheartedly, or do you only respond when it's convenient, when nothing 'better' is going on, or when you want to receive something from His hand?

4. Today, how will you respond to God's call upon your life? Will you dedicate yourself—and all your days and all your ways—to His service? Will you love those that God loves, and will you serve them as He has served you? Bonus question: will you take time to meet our guests—those who have come to have their bikes blessed—and make them feel welcome?
