Scripture Readings (ESV):

Genesis 50:22-26:

²² So Joseph remained in Egypt, he and his father's house. Joseph lived 110 years. ²³ And Joseph saw Ephraim's children of the third generation. The children also of Machir the son of Manasseh were counted as Joseph's own. ²⁴ And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but God will visit you and bring you up out of this land to the land that He swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob." ²⁵ Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here." ²⁶ So Joseph died, being 110 years old. They embalmed him, and he was put in a coffin in Egypt.

Mark 15:42-47:

⁴² And when evening had come, since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the Sabbath, ⁴³ Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. ⁴⁴ Pilate was surprised to hear that He should have already died. And summoning the centurion, he asked him whether He was already dead. ⁴⁵ And when he learned from the centurion that He was dead, he granted the corpse to Joseph. ⁴⁶ And Joseph bought a linen shroud, and taking Him down, wrapped Him in the linen shroud and laid Him in a tomb that had been cut out of the rock. And he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. ⁴⁷ Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph saw where He was laid.

Scripture: **Genesis 50:22-26; Mark 15:42-47**

Sermon: **This Bag of Bones**

1. Where do you see God working in the *small* details of your life? Do you sometimes miss Him there? Do you seek for grand expressions of God moreso than on a day-to-day basis?
2. Do you have faith in that God will continue to bless His people even when you will never see that here on earth? What motivates the kind of faith Joseph had even on his dying day?
3. Do you see how the Father's concern for Jesus' and Joseph's burials parallel His concern for the details of your life? Where do you find Him moving recently? Where can you look back in your life and proclaim, "He was there guiding me all along"?
4. When all is said and done, what legacy will your life leave for future generations? How will your life demonstrate one where grace and the Father's compassion abounded?
