I Peter 4:8-11:

⁸ Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. ⁹ Show hospitality to one another without grumbling. ¹⁰ As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: ¹¹ whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To Him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Luke 10:25-37:

²⁵ And behold, a lawyer stood up to put Him to the test, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" ²⁶ He said to him, "What is written in the Law? How do you read it?" ²⁷ And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸ And He said to him, "You have answered correctly; do this, and you will live."

²⁹ But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" ³⁰ Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead. ³¹ Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. ³² So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion. ³⁴ He went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he set him on his own animal and brought him to an inn and took care of him. ³⁵ And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, 'Take care of him, and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.' ³⁶ Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" ³⁷ He said, "The one who showed him mercy." And Jesus said to him, "You go, and do likewise."

Sermon Notes 05 November 2023 Scripture: I Peter 4:8-11; Luke 10:25-37 Sermon: Giving: Double Love

- 1. When it comes to giving and stewardship do you have "clean hands and a pure heart" (**Psalm 24:4**, which is part of our call to worship today)? How do your thinking and actions demonstrate that you are giving fully and lovingly and in a Christlike manner?
- 2. Are there areas of your giving of your time, talents, and treasure where you are still trying to justify yourself (like the lawyer, Luke 10:27), or are you demonstrating mercy fully in all these area and doing it with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength fulfilling the double love of the Great Commandment to God and neighbor, the person in need in your midst (Luke 10:37)?
- 3. Do you understand and utilize your spiritual gifts freely, generously and without grumbling (I Peter 4:8-11)? Do you share the Gospel and invite people to church, do you encourage and teach believers in this church to use their gifts in ministry, and do you do so without grumbling or complaining?
- 4. What commitments have you made and submitted with the Stewardship Brochure? How will you employ your time, talents, and treasure here at St. John's Evangelical Church to glorify Christ (I Peter 4:11) and to demonstrate mercy to others (Luke 10:37; 6:36; see also Luke 10:27, Deuteronomy 6:5) in 2024 to grow the ministry of this church spiritually, numerically, and effectively?
