

Advent Wreath Lighting

Fire burns. It hurts. It can destroy. Fire also gives warmth and light. The coming of Christ is both a day of judgment and a day of promise. Two candles, flickering brightly, help us remember that the coming of Christ has many meanings.

Scripture: "Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other. Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky" (**Psalm 85:10-11**).

The first two blue/purple candles are lit.

Light two candles; see them glow Brightly, so that all may know How two candles show the way Making our darkness bright as God's day.

Prayer: Dear God, we have much to do and we are not sure we will be ready for the day of Your coming. In Advent's light, help us to see what is important: to be who You want us to be, and to do what You would have us do. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Isaiah 40:1-11:

¹Comfort, comfort My people, says your God.

² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her

that her warfare is ended,

that her iniquity is pardoned,

that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³ A voice cries:

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

⁴ Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level,

and the rough places a plain.

- ⁵ And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

 - 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make His paths straight,'"
- ⁴ John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And he preached, saying, "After me comes He who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I have baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."



Sermon Notes 10 December 2023

Scripture: Isaiah 40:1-11; Mark 1:1-8

Sermon: Prepare the Way

1. How do you prepare the way for others to receive Christ in this Advent and Christmas season? How do you speak of God's comfort, peace, and forgiveness (Isaiah 40:1-3)?

2. How do you move from the cultural tendency to make Christmas celebrations personal/internal to making those celebrations about building a community and reaching out to others? [Think of the difference between the Peanuts and Charlotte's Web illustrations.]

3. How should we proclaim the eternal and immutable (unchanging) Word of God to a people that is perishing? How should we proclaim repentance alongside God's comforting presence (Isaiah 40:7-11)?

4. How did John the Baptist fulfill the prophecy of Isaiah 40? How can we speak the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ with our distinctive attributes (Mark 1:6) while orienting our ministry away from ourselves to the glory of Christ (Mark 1:7-8)? What specific acts would facilitate this?

Angels for the Elderly Food Drive: We will be collecting food for Angels for the Elderly again this year. Below is a suggested donation list. Please place items under the tree in the back of the sanctuary. Sample list of items needed: Bottled water, Canned vegetables - don't forget canned potatoes, Canned fruit, canned applesauce - (or small individual containers), Canned soup, Instant potatoes as well as bags of potatoes which can be divided for a few homes, Spaghetti sauce and pasta, Pancake mix and syrup, Canned meats (tuna, chicken, beef stew, etc.), Peanut butter and jelly, Macaroni & cheese, Cereal and/or instant oatmeal, Biscuit or baking mixes, especially those that only use water (don't forget Jiffy Mix), Boxed meals that require only water – also Tuna Helper & Hamburger Helper, Dried beans, Raisins - small boxes, Jello & pudding, Chapstick, hand or body lotion, body wash, Bars of soap, Cough drops, Deodorant, razors, toothbrushes & toothpaste, Shampoo & conditioner, Toilet paper, paper towels and facial tissue, Laundry detergent and dish soap, Adult disposable underwear, Socks, hats and gloves.
