

Scripture Readings (ESV):

Jeremiah 5:25-31: ²⁵Your iniquities have turned these away, and your sins have kept good from you. ²⁶ For wicked men are found among My people; they lurk like fowlers lying in wait. They set a trap; they catch men. ²⁷ Like a cage full of birds, their houses are full of deceit: therefore they have become great and rich; 28 they have grown fat and sleek. They know no bounds in deeds of evil; they judge not with justice the cause of the fatherless, to make it prosper, and they do not defend the rights of the needy. ²⁹ Shall I not punish them for these things? declares the LORD, and shall I not avenge Myself on a nation such as this?" ³⁰ An appalling and horrible thing has happened in the land: ³¹ the prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests rule at their direction; My people love to have it so, but what will you do when the end comes?

Luke 6:24-36:

²⁴ "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.

²⁵ "Woe to you who are full now, for you shall be hungry.
"Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep.
²⁶ "Woe to you, when all people speak well of you, for so their fathers did to the false prophets.

²⁷ "But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. ²⁹ To one who strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also, and

from one who takes away your cloak do not withhold your tunic^[a] either. ³⁰ Give to everyone who begs from you, and from one who takes away your goods do not demand them back. ³¹ And as you wish that others would do to you, do so to them.

³² "If you love those who love you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. ³³ And if you do good to those who do good to you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. ³⁴ And if you lend to those from whom you expect to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to get back the same amount. ³⁵ But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for He is kind to the ungrateful and the evil. ³⁶ Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful."



Sermon Notes 17 March 2024 Scripture: Jeremiah 5:25-31; Luke 6:24-36 Sermon: Woe, Woe, Whoa (Repent)

1. How do Jesus' words to His disciples speak to you? How are you challenged to put His words into practice?

- How do you demonstrate love for your enemies? How do you pray for them? To what lengths would you go to serve them and care for them?
- 3. How have our sins (individually, as believers, and as a nation) kept God from blessing us (see Jeremiah 5)? How are God's pronouncements for our generation as much as for the original hearers? How so?

4. How will you be merciful as your Father is merciful (**Luke 6:36**)? What changes in your attitude and your thinking will need to take place to enable you to accomplish that?
